Commission Meeting Minutes January 19, 2011

<u>The meeting was opened</u> at 10:10am by President R. Censullo who declared that it had been duly advertised in Accordance with the Open Public Meeting Act, Chapter 231 of the laws of 1975.

<u>Minutes of the meeting of September 30, 2010 were</u> unanimously approved as written and submitted on motion by V. Rivelli, second E. Grosvenor, unanimously carried.

<u>The Expenditure Report for the period September 30, 2010- December 31, 2010-</u> (attachment 1) was unanimously ratified on motion by H. Boor, second D. Drumeler.

Announcements:

R. Ferraiuolo provided an update as to staffing: Carrie Nawrocki had returned from maternity leave and as part of the ongoing organizational transition, would begin handling some of the duties of Health Officer, including representing the Commission on the Bio Watch Advisory Committee and attending Health Officer meetings. This was for purposes of continuity regardless of who would ultimately assume the position of Director.

In Carrie's absence Monique Davis had done an outstanding job in managing the "LINCS" program.

Marisol Leguizamon was due back by February 1st. In the interest of assisting the Commission she took neither disability or family leave, rather she took straight sick leave and has been assisting the administrative staff from home, which has proved invaluable. Her hours worked will be compensated as comp time upon her return. Overall, the transition was proceeding well and R. Ferraiuolo felt that despite the ultimate loss of a Director and Assistant Director all would work out well.

On motion by E. Grosvenor, second J. Ehret, unanimously carried the following administrative resolutions were approved.

Old Business:

<u>Report of Finance/Personnel Committee-</u> R. Ferraiuolo gave a report on the proceedings of the Personnel/ Finance Committee and made reference to the minutes which had been sent out in the package. (attachment VI)

J. Napolitano gave a presentation on revisions to the handbook which were not of great magnitude and had been approved by the F/P Committee. One exception being the provision that for purposes of post retirement medical benefits where the Commission's policy had been to provide for employee and spouse only, we were advised by New Jersey State Health Benefits, contrary to previous guidance, that it was required that if a spouse was covered then all dependants had to be covered as well up to age 26. It was an expense that had not been anticipated but was an absolute requirement of NJSHB, thus the handbook had to be amended to reflect the change.

R. Ferraiuolo indicated that it remained his feeling that the retirement age for PRM should be raised to 62, but he understood the counter agreement of forcing expensive personnel to stay. Both he and the Committee felt that it was very possible the State would take this action anyway, so for now, the matter was tabled.

It was requested that as the Finance/Personnel Committee progressed in its deliberations that the Board be kept of apprised. R. Ferraiuolo responded that he would promptly prepare and distribute minutes to each meeting and/or provide summaries as appropriate.

On motion by E. Grosvenor, second D. DeClemente, unanimously carried the amended handbook was approved as written and submitted. J. Napolitano indicated that he would convert the revisions into final form, do a final check and distribute.

New Business:

Proposal for Legal Services:

R. Ferraiuolo indicated that in response to a 'fair and open' advertisement for legal services he had taken receipt of only one proposal from Johnson and Conway (attachment VII). On motion by D. Drumeler, second F. Sasso, unanimously carried, the proposal for Johnson and Conway was approved.

<u>Proposal for Auditing Services for Fiscal Year -2010/11</u> (attachment VIII)

The Board considered a proposal from DeSena and Company for auditing services for fiscal year-2010. This was a professional services proposal being considered on a no bid basis. R. Ferraiuolo requested that regardless of who was selected the audit include the period up to June 30, 2011, which would be his retirement date. He indicated that if DeSena and Company were chosen the fee would be an additional 50% of the bid which would be recovered the following year. J. Napolitano stated that such an arrangement would have to consist of the regular audit covering fiscal year-2010 and an interim audit covering the period January 1-June 30, 2011.

After discussion, on motion by J. Sarnas, second J. Ehret, unanimously carried, the proposal submitted by De Sena and Company was approved. Additionally, the Director was authorized to engage services for the interim audit Jan 1-June 30, 2011 at 50% of the amount bid for the regular audit.

Approval for disposal of equipment/supplies (attachment IX)

R. Censullo, asked about liability associated with donations of this type of equipment/supplies and cautioned that it might be better to simply to discard

J. Napolitano indicated that any donations would have to be accompanied by a receipt indicating the use restrictions.

On motion by E. Grosvenor, second D. Drumeler, unanimously carried, R. Ferraiuolo was authorized to either donate or discard the equipment/supplies enumerated in attachment IX as having no further useful life.

H1N1 Supplemental Grant (attachment X)

R. Ferraiuolo gave a brief presentation on the referenced application for \$80,000. On motion by D. Drumeler, second E. Grosvenor, unanimously carried, R. Ferraiuolo was authorized to take receipt of the funding, execute the grant in accordance with the terms and provisions of the grantor and amend the 2011 Budget as appropriate.

2010 Budget Amendments

R. Ferraiuolo requested the following budget amendments:FromToAmountReserve for emergencyLegalS 6700operationsOvertime\$ 800

Also, R. Ferraiuolo explained that effective 10/1/10 there would be a change in the Revenue from Essex Regional Health Commission. A separate Agreement had been executed whereby the, Assistant Director services were contracted at an initial amount of \$2000 for Assistant Director and \$2500 for the Commission. The initial Agreement for the Director was essentially a 50/50 split. Over the years as the Essex Regional Health Commission approved increases for the Director, R. Ferraiuolo explained it had been his practice to split the increases with the Commission and Assistant Director.

In this process, it turns out that he had short changed himself by about \$950 year. Thus taking the entire amount of the contact (\$72,095) net of the piece relating to the Assistant Director should come out to two times the amount paid by the Commission to him (RF), or $32,234.00 x^2 = 64,468.00$ whereas it calculated out to 665,423.00.

J. Napolitano stated that in essence where the intention was to pay the Director at 50%, it turned out that he had in fact received some small fraction less than that.

R. Ferraiuolo stated that it was not his intention to seek an adjustment, either retroactive or otherwise, rather he was looking for guidance as to adjust anticipated revenue. The Commission agreed to keep the amounts as presently disbursed and reflect an adjustment on the basis of discontinuing that position relating to the Assistant Director. Thus \$72,095-\$6,672 or \$65,423 would be the revised bill and the Director would continue to receive \$32,234.00. The amendment for 2010 would be ¹/₄ of \$6,672=\$1,668.

On motion by E. Grosvenor, second H. Boor, the foregoing amendments to the 2010 Budget were unanimously approved.

J. Napolitano advised the Board that it would be beneficial for the Commission to have a certified purchasing agent, either by contract or in house. Marisol Leguizamon was mentioned as a possibility because she was a licensed CMFO and was the Commission's Chief Financial Officer.

On motion by J. Sarnas, second E. Grosvenor, unanimously carried, it was agreed that an 'in house' option would be pursued.

Funding formula for Mini Grant

It was agreed that the formula for awarding Mini Grants was not equitable in that large regional departments got the same as smaller units.

It was agreed that J. Sarnas would write a letter on behalf of the HCHOA to the NJHOA.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 11:15am on motion by D. DeClemente, second E.Grosvenor.

Meeting opened at 11:10am.

<u>Revised Handbook</u>. J. Napolitane and R. Ferraiuele went over changes either required by the JIF (Joint Insurance Fund) to clarify ambiguities or bring certain provisions into compliance with prevailing regulations. An example of the latter was the Commission provided post retirement benefits for employee and spouse. However, with the retirement of G. Garetane we found that NJSHB does not permit this. Either the employee only or entire family has to be covered, thus the change in the handbook.

Upon presentation, discussion and minor changes, the Handbook was unanimously approved for recommendation for adoption to the full Board.

<u>Recruitment of Director/Revised T.O:</u> At the request of the Committee, R. Ferrainole proposed four options and related tables of organization.

1 & 2) Director/Health Officer with and without an Assistant Director

3) Director without Health Officer License and Assistant Director/ Health Officer.

4) Contract Health Officer

The Committee expressed concern about the transition because of the unique nature of the Commission and the long tenure and record of R. Ferraiuelo.

R. Ferraiuolo thanked them for the compliment but pointed out that he was confident that the Commission was in sufficient fiscal and organizational health to have long term success. Further, he stated that attrition was an integral part of his fiscal planning which was why he suggested 'promotion from within' be given very serious consideration.

He stated that he was generally aware that the concept of returning to work post retirement was something largely frowned upon for reasons of appearance and contrary to his own philosophy on attrition.

However, in his case, if the Beard found itself in need, he would be willing to return to help out if he could for either a nominal sum, or perhaps pro bone, for as long as it took to resolve any problems.

The Committee discussed the various options recommended by R. Ferraiuole and decided to defer a firm recommendation on structure until such time that prospective candidates could be interviewed. It was agreed he the Director would reach out to three candidates, L. Jones, Health Officer Union County(contract options) V. Carter, NJDHSS and Greg Williams, Mesquite Control (non Health Officer options).

Interviews would be scheduled for the end of next month.

Jome Richards- Haz Mat Assignment:

R. Ferraiuole reported that Jome Richards would be assigned to cover Haz/Mat in place of G. Garetane. He was requesting permission to assign him a vehicle for commuting.

The Commission unanimously agreed and took the position that such matters should be left up to the Director. R. Ferrainole mentioned that at one time such was the case but he believed that for reasons unknown to him the policy had been changed.

Post Retirement Medical Benefits: (PRMB)

R. Ferrainele presented the Committee with a spread sheet reflecting the cost, both present and projected of PRMB. He expressed his opinion that the age of retirement was a major factor in cost control and recommended that increasing it be given serious consideration. Under NJSHB regulations, the age could be raised to 62 or 65 (where Medicare kicks in). The only argument to the contrary would be forcing people to stay longer with associated cost. However, R. Ferrainole feit that employees could still retire and defer PRMB.

There was discussion about increasing contributions and other options.

In the end, it was agreed to table the matter pending what additional contributions might be required by the State in the very near future.

The meeting concluded at 2:45pm.
